These assessments help teachers identify each child's strengths and needs, ensuring they receive the necessary support for kindergarten readiness.

Financial Security in Our Community...

On October 22, our Eviction Reduction Coordinator, China Tatum, attended the Housing Virginia's Most Vulnerable conference in Richmond. While there, she was also a speaker, along with other grantees throughout the state, on the VERP (Virginia Eviction Reduction Pilot) panel entitled "Collaborative

Strategies for Eviction Reduction: A Virginia Pilot Program." This panel provided data points on how funds are stretched, presence is proved and continues to make a difference in the courtroom, and how the partnerships formed within communities extends beyond the work of the pilot program each day.







Healthy Community...

Our CHWs are pleased to announce the beginning of the Virginia Heart Ambassador Blood Pressure Self-Monitoring Program (HHA BPSM)! This series will be 8 sessions, alternating weeks, focusing on home blood pressure monitoring and nutrition education.

How It Works: UWHCM's CHWs Healthy Heart Ambassadors will provide one-on-one office hours and nutrition information to participants.

Participant Eligibility*: All participants must be 18 years or older and diagnosed with hypertension by a healthcare professional.

Equipment: Participants receive a free blood pressure monitor as part of the program.
